

MEDITATION

June 18, 2023

The Eleventh Sunday In Ordinary Time

You shall be my special possession. (Exodus 19:5)

Even before God had said these words to Moses on Mount Sinai, the Israelites must have known how special they were to him. Just three months earlier, God had miraculously delivered them from slavery in Egypt. And as they journeyed through the wilderness, he had given them manna from heaven, water from a rock, and victory in battle (Exodus 16, 17). It was abundantly clear that they were "dearer to me than all other people" (19:5).

Yet how quickly the people lost sight of this amazing truth! In a short time, they would think that the Lord had abandoned them and would make a golden calf to worship instead (Exodus 32). Still, despite their sin, God continued to be with them and guide them (34:10-11).

Through Christ, we, too, have become God's special possession, and it's abundantly clear just how dear we are to him. Out of love for us, he sent his only Son to suffer and die for our sins so that we could live with him forever. In love, he offers us himself as the Living Bread from heaven to strengthen us, along with the grace we need to obey his commandments.

Yet like the Israelites, we may sometimes think that God has abandoned us. That's especially true when things go awry in our lives. But the truth is that the Lord could never forget any one of his beloved children. He has called you, the unique, unrepeatable person he created, to be in a personal, intimate relationship with him. And just as he did with the Israelites, he will continue to love you and forgive you even when you fail.

As you approach the altar at Mass today, remember that you are God's special possession. He has chosen you. And when you receive the Eucharist, tell him that you are choosing *him!* As you return to your pew, try to sense his delight at spending this precious time so close to you.

"Father, may I never forget how special I am to you!"

In Celebration of Graduations, the following excerpt from Sr. Paul Mary from her École Saint-Louis, remembrances. "The school was all staffed by sisters and then we got our first lay teacher. Dorothy Murphy, a graduate from St. Joseph's Academy. She was one of the first lay teachers in the parochial schools and I don't know how we managed to pay her. She taught 3rd and 4th. Sr. Christine taught 5th and 6th. Sr. Severina taught 1st and 2nd grade - she was a wonderful teacher. I was at the school for five or six years. This was my first experience as a principal. I really didn't expect the things that other more experienced people would have expected. Of course, the idea of a secretary was impossible so I was my own secretary, which wasn't too bad. The only phone was in my office so whenever the telephone rang or there was somebody at the back door or the front door or playground door (the classroom had three doors: one led into the library, one that led out to the front, and one that led our to the back door), it was usually for me. So, I would have to tell the class (7th and 8th) to just work on their math or they do oral reading as much as they could or if they were reading a book to continue reading and they had been doing this for years. It was a tradition that if the principal had to leave the room they would just carry on; they did not take this time to play or talk, it was carry on with what you were doing. One time, we were reading the story of Ichabod Crane, about Sleepy Hollow, and I would read sections of it just so they could get more of the flavorso they could enjoy the
