
BAPTISMS

MEDITATION

Sunday, April 20, 2025

The Resurrection of the Lord

They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him. (John 20:2)

What a glorious day! It's Easter Sunday, and the day of the resurrection. Only Jesus isn't showing up! In fact, today's Gospel reading focuses on an *absent* Jesus. Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John are confronted with an empty tomb, and they don't know where he is. So rather than rejoicing, they are disappointed, bewildered, and scared.

These three disciples didn't know what happened to Jesus, but we do. In just a short time, he will greet Mary Magdalene and commission her to proclaim the good news (John 20:16-18). Later that day, he will appear to Peter and the apostles and breathe the Holy Spirit on them (20:22). And he will appear to them again and again before ascending into heaven (Acts 1:3).

But we don't hear any of those stories today. Instead, we're waiting outside the empty tomb. We believe that Jesus is risen, but we don't see him. We have experienced our sin being washed away, but we still fall sometimes. We get occasional glimmers of the heavenly life that awaits us, but we also know times of darkness and fear. And, so we live somewhat precariously, always at risk of falling to temptation.

So why bother rejoicing today? Because Jesus truly is risen, whether we see him or not! Because he truly *has* defeated death, and we truly *do* belong to him. Because we *will* see him one day. And until that day comes, we can experience his Spirit filling us with God's love and gradually transforming our hearts.

Today truly is a glorious day—not because we have come to the end of our journey, but because we know that the risen Christ is walking beside us. Step-bystep, he is leading us to the throne of God—to a glory that will far surpass our wildest dreams!
