MEDITATION

August 11, 2024

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This is enough, O Lord! Take my life. (1 Kings 19:4)

Elijah is fed up. Fleeing for his life into the desert, he finds his way to a broom tree, where he collapses in despair. Alone and exhausted, he prays for death: "this is enough, O Lord! Take my life" (1 Kings 19:4).

But God doesn't answer his prayer. Instead, he sends an angel to care for Elijah's needs. "Get up and eat," the angel commands the disillusioned prophet, lest "the journey will be too long for you" (1 Kings 19:7). Elijah awakes and discovers that God has miraculously provided him with bread and water to strengthen him. Elijah had given up hope in the Lord, but the Lord had not given up on Elijah.

At some point, we may feel we have come to the end of our rope. Trials or grief, sickness or disappointment can rob us of our hope. Like Elijah, we might tell the Lord, "Enough!"

In those moments, our God is close to us, even if we can't feel it. Just as the Lord saw Elijah under that solitary broom tree, he sees us. He sees you. And just as he provided for Elijah, he will provide you with bread as well so that your journey won't be too much. But it won't be ordinary bread; it will be the "living bread that came down from heaven" (John 6:51). It will be nothing less than Jesus' own flesh and blood, the Eucharistic bread that gives us eternal life.

Today as you go to Mass, come to Jesus with an open, sincere heart. Don't be afraid to be honest with him; tell him about your needs and your burdens. Then, as you receive his Body and Blood, receive his strength and hope. Even if you can't receive Jesus sacramentally today, he is still with you. He is filling you with the grace you need to continue on. He will answer your cry for help. He will never give up on you!

The Society of Mary was blessed with vocations and as early as 1863 Marist Fathers were being sent to America to engage in the care of souls. During Advent, 1885, Marist Fr. Le Menant des Chesnais, S.M. preached a mission in St. Louis Church. Rev. Claude Genis,* pastor of the church, offered his parish to the Society of Mary, through the interposition of the visiting preacher. Archbishop Ireland, knowing the Marists from the days of his studies for the priesthood, was desirous to entrust the parish to the Marist Fathers permanently.

"Most Holy Father, - John Ireland, Bishop of St. Paul in Minnesota, most humbly prostrate at the feet of Your Holiness would like to set forth the following: Among the parishes of the city of St. Paul of the aforementioned Diocese, there is a certain one named St. Louis for the benefit of the faithful of French origin who have kept their mother tongue. Now since French-speaking secular priests are not easily found, the Bishop, on the advice of the diocesan Consultors, earnestly begs Your Holiness to be so kind as to grant him the faculty of entrusting in perpetuum the aforementioned parish to the Priests of the Society of Mary, who have already been serving the same parish for four months and who are, furthermore, disposed to taking on its administration in perpetuum. Wherefore, etc."

"From the Audience Held on January 16, 1887 - Our Most Holy Lord, Leo XIII, Supreme Pontiff by Divine Providence, has referred to me the undersigned, Archbishop of Tyre and Secretary of the Sacred Congregation of Propaganda Fide, your request. His Holiness has kindly deigned to grant the favor requested and hereunto attached provided

A MARIST SAINT

On August 2nd, we celebrated the Feast of St. Peter Julian Eymard. He grew up with a strong devotion to Mary and the Eucharist. After completing the seminary, he was ordained a diocesan priest at the age of 23. Dissatisfied with parish work, he joined the Marists, and worked with lay organizations to promote Marian and Eucharistic devotions, especially the 40 Hours Devotion. He founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament for men and Servants of the Blessed Sacrament for women, and wrote extensively on the Eucharist.

He wrote: "He loves, He hopes, He waits...Our Lord prefers to wait Himself for the sinner for years rather than keep him waiting one instant." Jesus is waiting for you, right now. Don't keep him waiting any longer.
