MEDITATION

July 24, 2022

The Seventeenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Father . . . (*Luke* 11:2)

Imagine the insider's view that Jesus' disciples must have had. They lived with him; they ate and drank with him. They saw his countless everyday interactions, most of which weren't recorded in Scripture. But today's Gospel gives us one that did.

Luke tells us that Jesus was praying, as he often did. The disciples must have observed him because they asked, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1). In response, Jesus gave them more than a set of words or a format or technique. He gave them an example and an invitation: to have a share in his own loving relationship with his

How amazing that Jesus teaches the disciples to call God "Father" (Luke 11:2)! What a privilege to speak so directly and familiarly to God! The Hebrew Scriptures had referred to God as the father of the people of Israel or father of the king (Deuteronomy 32:6; 2 Samuel 7:14). But here, Jesus invites his disciples to call almighty God their own Father. Jesus likely used the word Abba, a word that expresses the bond of a child with his father. Isn't that amazing? Jesus gives them his own status as children of God and tells them to pray with the same childlike trust that he has (Luke 10:21).

Of course, this boldness didn't come naturally to the disciples—and it doesn't come naturally to us. So Jesus gives all of us an insider's view of the kind of Father we have. He is more merciful and generous than the best human father (Luke 6:36; 11:13). He is attentive to our needs and always ready to hear and answer our prayers (12:30; 11:10). He will not give us a scorpion when we ask for an egg (11:12). He is rich in kindness and forgiveness (23:34). How awesome that he welcomes us as his children!

Jesus wants to give you the courage to pray, "Father." So at Mass today, pray the Lord's Prayer with gratitude and awe that God is your loving Father.

"Father! Thank you for making me your child."


An Invitation to Hope


