MEDITATION

July 3, 2022

The Fourteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

*I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky.
(Luke 10:18)*

Imagine the impact these seventy-two disciples must have made as they fanned out through the regions of Galilee and Samaria. Thousands of people up and down the Jordan Valley were hearing the good news of salvation. The mercy of God flowed freely as they were healed and delivered from the grip of demons. It's no wonder the disciples were so excited when they returned!

It's no wonder, too, that Jesus told them he had seen Satan fall from the sky while they were gone (Luke 10:18). The mission of the seventy-two marked a dramatic escalation in God's plan of salvation. Now, instead of having to contend with only Jesus and the Twelve, the devil was seeing a lot more people driving out his minions in a lot more places. And it was only going to keep growing.

This is your story as well. You are part of a two thousand-yearlong line of men and women whom Jesus has empowered to announce the good news. Your spiritual lineage includes great saints like Francis of Assisi and Mother Teresa of Calcutta, but it also includes millions upon millions of unknown saints who have pushed back the darkness of the devil. It includes you.

Every time you forgive someone, you are snuffing out another fiery dart from the "accuser of our brothers" (Revelation 12:10). Every time you reach out to give generously of your time or resources to someone who is hurting, you are disarming the one who is a "thief" and whose only goal is to "destroy" (John 10:10). Every time you share the truth about God's love, you are silencing the "father of lies" (8:44). Bit by bit, step-by-step, you are contributing to the devil's ultimate defeat.

Yes, you! Clothed with the authority of Christ, you can overcome even the devil.

"All praise to you, Jesus, for letting me share in your victory over the evil one!"

FEATURED ON THE COVER: The Monstrance in St. Louis, King of France. We can thank Saint Pierre-Julien Eymard, (4 February 1811 – 1 August 1868). In January of 1851 Père Eymard made a pilgrimage to the shrine of **Our Lady of Fourvières**, and there promised Mary to devote his life to founding a congregation of priests whose principal duty should be to honor the Blessed Sacrament. On 6 January, 1857, the Blessed Sacrament was exposed, and the nascent community commenced **The Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament**.

Julian Eymard was a diocesan priest (ordained in 1834) who, a few years later, **became a Marist**, and would become Marist Provincial of Lyons. He was a friend and contemporary of Saints John Vianney, Peter Chanel and Marcellin Champagnat, Blessed Basil Moreau and Pauline-Marie Jaricot.

Did you know: One of Eymard's novices — after Eymard became the founder of the Blessed Sacrament Fathers — was the French sculptor Auguste Rodin? When Rodin entered the Congregation as a lay brother in 1862, he recognized Rodin's talent and advised him to return to his vocation. 'My son, you have better things to do in life than to be a priest. God has not called you to religion.'
