MEDITATION

June 12, 2022

The Most Holy Trinity

I have much more to tell you. (John 16:12)

Had Jesus run out of time? Why didn't he tell his disciples everything he had in mind? Had the Last

Supper taken too long?

No, Jesus' timing was always perfect. He knew his hour had come—it hadn't snuck up on him. And he was always ready for whatever he had to do. Rather, Jesus had "much more" to teach his disciples because they weren't ready to hear it. They couldn't understand everything yet. They needed time and experience—and

a lot of help from the Holy Spirit.

Like those disciples, we have much more to learn. We don't quite comprehend a lot of what Jesus teaches, and we need the Spirit's help to live out the things that we do understand. Take today's feast of the Holy Trinity as a classic example. Every Sunday we proclaim that we believe in one God in three divine Persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But the Trinity is a mystery we will never fully comprehend. Jesus certainly has a lot he can teach us—about the Trinity and so much more. He unfolds these mysteries for us over our lifetime, as we seek him and open ourselves to the Spirit.

How blessed we are! Jesus loves to reveal his truths to us, and he offers us everything we need to understand him. He has overcome the sin that clouds our minds and hinders us from seeking and knowing God. Not only that, but he has given us the Spirit, who lives in us and helps us understand the truths of our faith. And he has given us the Church, where we receive the Scriptures, the sacraments, and brothers and sisters who love us. All these things help to reveal more and more to us about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

There's always more to learn from the Lord. Jesus is

ready. Are you?

near the Basilica of St. Anthony which was still being built, his mother promised if the child was restored to her she would give for the poor an amount of corn equal to the child's weight. Her prayer and promise were rewarded with the boy's return to life.

Founded in France: In 1888 Louise Bouffier was a baker in Toulon, France. A locksmith was prepared to break open her shop door after no key would open it. Bouffier asked the locksmith to try his keys one more time after she prayed and promised to give bread to the poor in honor of St. Anthony if the door would open without force. The door then opened. After many others received favors through the intercession of St. Anthony, in the 1890s they joined Louise victured in the left niche Anthony's Bread. In 1263, when it is said a child drowned Bouffier in founding the charity of "St. Anthony's Bread."

We ask for your support of this much needed renovation.




