MEDITATION

June 5, 2022

Pentecost Sunday

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:4)

No one who was gathered in the upper room on Pentecost could have missed the presence of the Holy Spirit. A strong, driving wind, tongues of fire, and the apostles speaking in different languages: it was clear that Jesus' promise of the Spirit coming upon them had been fulfilled (John 14:16). But that promise wasn't just for the apostles long ago: it's for us today as well. So let's take the opportunity on this great feast to pray for a greater outpouring of the Spirit in our lives.

"Holy Spirit, you appeared as tongues of fire. I want the fire of your love to burn in my heart. Give me a love that never grows cold, along with the zeal to spread your saving message to all whom I encounter each day.

"Holy Spirit, you gave gifts to the disciples to build your Church. In order to do your work, I need gifts that can only come from you—gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, and strength; gifts of prophecy, healing, and discernment of spirits (Isaiah 11:2; 1 Corinthians 12:7-10). You know that I am asking for these gifts not just for myself but so that I can also bring you glory and lead other people to you. In this season of my life, I especially ask for the gift of ______. But whatever you want to give me, I am open to receiving it.

"Holy Spirit, you opened Peter's ears so that he could hear the message you wanted him to preach. Open my ears too so that I am able to hear you. I want to be your instrument—to act on whatever you are urging me to do. I can't do that without staying attuned to your voice, so help me to listen to you over the noise and busyness of each day.

"Holy Spirit, as you did with the disciples on Pentecost, empower your people today. Together may we preach the good news and build your kingdom on earth!"

"Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with your love, your grace, and your gifts."

The bulletin cover photo is a detail of the window of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. A gift in 1914 of la Ligue du Sacré Cœur de la Paroisse. The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost, which this year is June 24. *Marguerite-Marie Alacoque* (1647 – 1690) Beatified September 18, 1864 by Pope Pius IX. Canonized May 13, 1920 by Pope Benedict XV.

Fr. Paul Rulquin, S.M., 7th and 10th Pastor (1907-1913 and 1926-1939) commissioned the designs of the windows to artisans Robert T. & Isabella Giles. He would not see the 1914 installed windows until his return in 1926. **Note**: in 1914, these French saints -Margaret Mary, our patrons Bernadette, and Peter Chanel were all beatified but none were as yet canonized.




