MEDITATION

Sunday, November 17, 2024

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In those days...

Mark 13:24-32

When will “those days” come (Mark 13:24)? When will we see the final tribulations that lead up to Jesus’ return? Many early Christians expected to see them in their own lifetime. Even today, some think the end is approaching when they hear of wars, pandemics, earthquakes, and other disasters. But as Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel, only our heavenly Father knows when that day will come (13:32).

What is certain, though, is that there *will* be an end. After a period of great distress and tribulation, Jesus will come “to judge the living and the dead,” as we proclaim in the Creed. We hope to be one of “his elect” whom the angels gather from the ends of the earth (Mark 13:27). But the images in today’s first reading and the Gospel can still frighten us.

Yet instead of making us feel afraid of the future, these readings should influence the choices we make today. The truth is, we can’t presume on God’s mercy forever. As St. Paul wrote, “Now is the day of salvation” (2 Corinthians 6:2). *Now* is the time to turn to the Lord. To follow him the best way we can. To ask for forgiveness every time we detect sin in our lives. *Now* is the time to live in a way that makes us ready to meet the Lord whenever he comes again.

So don’t procrastinate! Offer him your day each morning in prayer. Receive the sacraments as often as you can—there’s grace available to you every time you do. Call that needy friend today, not tomorrow, and ask how you can serve her. The Lord will give you all the grace you need to be ready to meet him face-to-face.

It’s so easy to let other things take priority in our lives and push out the time and energy we need to devote to our relationship with God. Don’t let that happen! No matter when the end times come, Jesus wants you to follow him now so you can be with him forever in eternity.

FEATURED SAINT

On November 18, we celebrate the feast day of Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne. She was from Grenoble, France. She founded the first American house of the Religious of the Sacred Heart and opened the First American free school west of the Mississippi. She is known for her courage and desire to serve Native Americans, especially, the Potawatomi who called her “the woman who prays always.” She died in 1852 at the age of eighty-three at St. Charles, Missouri.
