
#### **BAPTISMS**

#### **MEDITATION**

Sunday, October 20, 2024

#### Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### *Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.* (*Mark* 10:35-45

What a bold demand! James and John seem to have forgotten what Jesus had taught them about greatness. He had just rebuked them: "Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it" (Mark 10:15). Jesus' model of greatness confounded them because in his kingdom, "[the] last will be first" (10:31).

James and John should have known that Jesus valued humility, not prominence. They should have remembered, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9"35). But all they could think about was their position in his kingdom. They wanted to be great, to be important, to be right up front with Jesus. But he insisted that "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" Mark (10:45).

Jesus' model of greatness challenges our expectations, too. We all want to be great in some way. We might want to be admired at work or seen as a good parent. We might even want to do great things for God: to live a holy life, to make a difference in the world, or to raise a family that loves Jesus and serves the Church. These are all good desires. Even James and John's willingness to drink the cup with Jesus was a good one. Their desires just needed to be purified—and so do ours. Rather than demanding that God bend to our will and do for us whatever we ask, we need to yield to his will.

Like James and John, we need a servant's heart. We need the kind of heart that Jesus showed when he taught and healed and fed the hungry, when he washed his disciples' feet, and when he offered his body and blood. We need to imitate Jesus when he didn't make demands but yielded to his Father, saying, "Not my will but yours be done" (Luke 22:42). May we embrace the heart of our Savior!

"Jesus, I let go of my demands. Make me a servant like you."

#### FEATURED SAINT

October 22nd is the feast of St. John Paul II, Pope. Karol Jozef Wotjtyla was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. As Archbishop of Krakow, he took part in the Second Vatican Council. On October 16, 1978, he was elected pope and took the name of John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and Eastern Churches, and the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal*. Pope John Paul II departed peacefully in the Lord on 2 April, 2005. Pope Francis canonized him on 27 April, 2014.
