
BAPTISMS

MEDITATION

Sunday, October 6, 2024

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is not good for the man to be alone. (Genesis 2:18)

This almost sounds like it could be the punch line of a joke about men needing the gentle guidance of women. But this reading is not just about men. And while it's often used in the context of marriage, it's not just about marriage. It applies to all of us, married or single, male or female. We *need* each other. We have been made in the image and likeness of our triune God, who is a communion of persons. That means we need upbuilding relationships with other people. It is simply "not good" for us to be alone (Genesis 2:18).

Notice that even after Adam named all the animals, none were found to be "the suitable partner for the man" (Genesis 2:20). That's because we can only truly have "partnership" with other human beings created in God's image and likeness. And that communion, like the life of the Trinity, usually involves the giving of ourselves. The Sacrament of Marriage is a powerful sign of that love. But it's also on display in the relationships between good friends, in volunteers who work together to serve the poor, or in priests or religious sisters and brothers who support one another in the faith.

It's not automatic, though. No one experiences perfect communion with other in this life; we have to work on our relationships. We have to keep inviting Jesus into them. So today, take the next step toward the communion that God made you for. Pray for good friendships to come into your life. Pray, too, that God would help you deepen the relationships you *do* have. Make it a priority to spend time with them. Get to know the people you're serving with in your parish. Maybe you could reach out to someone who seems alone.

Even when you feel lonely, know that you're never alone. The One who made you for something more is always with you. Trust that he will build the communion he desires for you.
